While the Trump administration is directionally positive on pipeline permitting, the reality is that the NEPA process remains unchanged, Federal permitting still relies on obtaining State and multiple agency approvals and Federal processes for deconflicting multiple agency approval are still nascent. Stakeholder challenges at the local level are rising in number and intensity. Unexpected delays can undermine and frustrate the entire project team.

We believe early planning, trust building engagement strategies with regulators and much improved planning prior to the release of environmental reports, and coordinated but differentiated strategies for dealing with local and national stakeholders can avoid litigation and negative publicity and expedite multi-agency, multi-jurisdiction permitting approvals.
